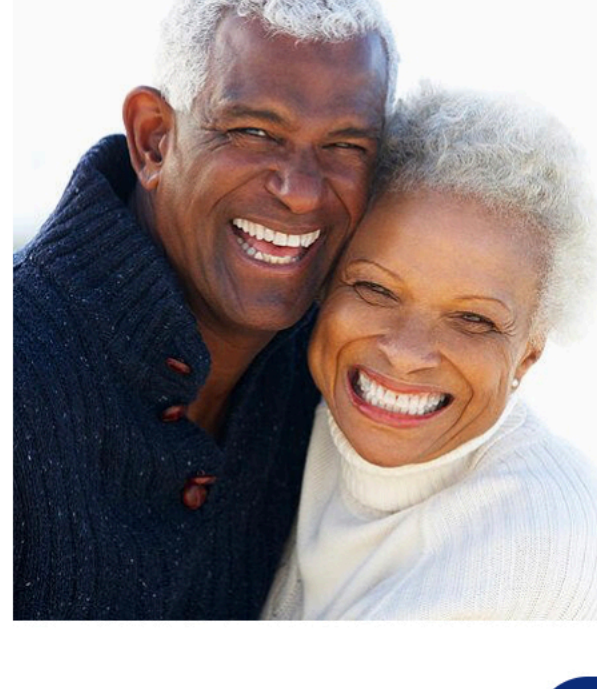


Did you know that bladder cancer is the fourth most common cancer in the United States? More than 82,000 new cases of bladder cancer are diagnosed in the U.S. each year.
